The city of **Ulm** is situated in the south of Germany on the banks of the River Danube. It is famous for its Cathedral with the **highest steeple tower in the world** and its medieval Fishermen's Quarter.

For generations this has been an innovative region and a place where the pioneering spirit thrives. Forward-looking thinkers, designers and inventors have lived and worked here, for example the astronomist Johannes Kepler or Max Bill as the founder of former Ulm Design School. And actually Ulm was the birthplace of the physicist and Nobel prize winner **Albert Einstein**. The town provides a **wide range of cultural and sports programs** which are used by 3100 students of the Hochschule Ulm.

## The Programs

The International Engineering Programs (IEP) are offered by the Hochschule Ulm (Ulm University of Applied Sciences) to international students. The programs run for three months and are taught in English. They offer a variety of different courses in the fields of Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering (IMEP), Computer Science/Engineering (ICEP), and Electrical Engineering (IEEP). The lectures are accredited allowing the students to transfer credits back home.



## Excursions

Many field trips are organized to different companies in the area.



## Language Courses

To get to know Germany and the German culture the International Office also organizes trips for example to the Oktoberfest in Munich, to the Christmas Market in Nürnberg or to Neuschwanstein Castle.

The IEP are accompanied by parallel German language classes for different levels.

Ulm University of Applied Sciences is offering an intensive German language course for students with no or a little knowledge of German. The course takes place before the start of the International Engineering Programs in March or in September and runs two weeks.
